

PREVENT OLDER ADULTS FROM EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS:

SUPPORT THE ADOPTION OF AN UPSTREAM HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION INITIATIVE FOR LOW-INCOME OLDER ADULT RENTERS

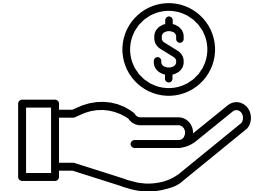
The number of retirement-age households facing cost burdens has reached an all-time high,¹ and homelessness among older adults is expected to nearly triple by 2030.²



In Massachusetts, older adults make up 38% of extremely low income renter households.³



Older adults living alone in Massachusetts are more likely to face economic insecurity than other older adults living alone in any other states.⁴



The cost of living for older adult couples who rent is the highest in Massachusetts (\$51,276, which is 124% of the national average).⁴

The Problem

The Solution

- Provide \$10 million in the state budget to create bridge subsidies for up to 1,000 older adults facing housing instability to allow them to remain in place while they await approval for state or federally-funded public housing or a subsidy through the Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (MRVP).
- Low-income older adults participating in the bridge subsidy program would pay 30% of their income towards rent, with the bridge subsidy making up the difference in the total rent, up to 110% of the fair market rent. The program would be administered by the Executive Office of Elder Affairs (EOEA) in collaboration with the Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC).
